Worshiping the Lord and Obeying the Governor

The Lord commands us to regularly gather to worship (Hebrews 10:24-25), and it is our joy and priority to obey Him in this. There is no place we would rather be on the Lord's Day than worshiping with the Lord's people.

However, the Lord also commands us to submit to our governing authorities (Romans 13:1-7, 1 Peter 2:13-17). Today, Governor Newsom released Executive Order N-25-20, ordering all California residents to follow any orders and guidance of state and local public health officials.

This means we must follow <u>new guidance from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH)</u>, which includes the following, effective through at least the end of March:

- Large gatherings that include 250 people or more should be postponed or canceled.
- Smaller gatherings held in venues that do not allow social distancing of six feet per person should be postponed or canceled.

Changes in March 2020

We do not want to act in fear or panic. But out of love for neighbor, submission to our authorities, a priority of the health and safety of the most vulnerable in our community, and a desire to be above reproach, we are following <u>the</u> <u>example of church history</u>, and have made the difficult decision to take the following actions, effective through at least the end of March:

It is a time for us to show that our ultimate hope is not in the stock market or our physical health; it is in the Lord.

Five centuries ago, the Heidelberg Catechism asked and answered the most important question:

What is your only comfort in life and in death?

That I am not my own, But belong body and soul, in life and in death to my faithful Savior Jesus Christ.

> He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven: in fact, all things must work together for my salvation.

Because I belong to Him, Christ, by His Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for Him.

Christ was their hope then. He is our hope today.

So let us continue to hope in and live for Him today.
